



Question

Can the Port provide filling permits for anything in Sec. 26-25-13, from 1904-1911; specifically Block 65 – Lot 19 or Lots 1-19?

Answer

It appears the Port's files do not contain information on fill permits from 1904-11. It is important to note, the Port was established between the years of 1909-1912. There are meeting minutes dating to the Port's creation. A very basic skim in the archives of the first few meetings, starting in May 1909, indicated there are no property deeds, agendas listing permits or such contained as part of the early record. The minutes tend to deal with legal issues related to establishment of the Port and resolutions related to taxing, bonding and dredging.

You are welcome to review the minutes, but it's unlikely those will contain information related to your request. If you would like Port staff to do a formal search of the meeting minutes you would need to specify the timeframe. The charge would be \$40 an hour for any time more than 15 minutes involved in the search.
